


A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT...







- "I am a serious stamp collector and one of my collecting interests in the area of Catholic seals. These are stamps issued by various Catholic organizations for publicity, fund-raising etc. One example is the K of C Pittsburgh Bishop's Project seals that have been issued annually since 1959. I am researching these and wonder if members can help. Some specific questions:
- Does any member have any background, records or archives from this project?
- Two seals featuring Bishop Dearden were apparently produced by the Pittsburgh K o C in 1957 and 1958 that were not part of the Bishop's Project (that began in 1959). Does anyone have information about these?
- I have example of seals from many years but am missing some years in the 1980's and 1990's if any members have spare copies.
- If members have old seals that are gathering dust and need a good home, I am happy to take them off of your hands. Any quantity!
