

The date of the winter solstice varies from year to year, and can fall anywhere from December 20-23, but the 21st and 22nd are the most common dates. The reason for


this is because the tropical year – the time it takes for the sun to return to the same spot relative to Earth – is different from the calendar year.

SUPREME ASSESSMENTS REINSTATED AS OF 1/1/2022

Given the gradual return to normalcy in council operations, the Board of Directors voted to reinstate the assessment process beginning January 1, 2022, which had until now been waived during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The standard assessments are as follows:

•Per Capita assessment in the amount of \$1.75 will be levied on the membership of record as of January 1, 2022 (excluding honorary and exempt members).

•Catholic Advertising assessment in the amount of \$0.50 will be levied on the membership of record as of January 1, 2022 (excluding honorary and exempt members).

•Culture of Life assessment in the amount of \$1.00 will be levied on the membership of record in the United States and Canada as of January 1, 2022

(excluding honorary, honorary life, exempt and inactive insurance members).

CATHOLIC NEWS...

• On the second day of his visit to Cyprus on December 3, 2021, Pope Francis met with the Holy Synod of the Cypriot Orthodox Church. During his address, the Pope underlined the common bonds between the Catholic and Orthodox Churches and his desire to deepen ecumenical dialogue. Pope Francis assured those present of his prayers and closeness, and that of the Catholic Church, in the most troubling problems that beset them and "in the best and boldest hopes that spur you on." "Your sorrows and your joys are also ours; we sense them as our own. At the same time, we feel great need of your prayers."



Happy Birthday to Pope Francis who celebrated his 85th birthday on December 17, 2021. Pope Francis celebrated with a group of refugees to the Vatican whom he helped to gain asylum in Italy. The refugees arrived in Italy on Dec. 16 after the pope helped to arrange their transfer from Cyprus to Italy during his apostolic trip to Greece and Cyprus earlier this month.

"Perspective"

For a small amount of perspective at this moment, imagine you were born in 1900. When you are fourteen, World War I start, and ends on your 18th birthday with twenty-two million people killed. Later in the year, a Spanish Flu epidemic hits the planet and runs until you are twenty. Fifty million people die from it in those two years. Yes, fifty million.

When you are twenty-nine, the Great Depression begins. Unemployment hits 25%, global GDP drops 27%. That runs until you are thirty-three. The country nearly collapses along with the world economy. When you turn thirty-nine, World War II starts. You are not even over the hill yet.

When you are forty-one, the United States is fully pulled into WWII. Between your 39th and 45th birthday, seventy-five million people perish in the war and the Holocaust kills six million. At 52, the Korean War starts and five million perish.

At 64 the Vietnam War begins, and it does not end for many years. Four million people die in that conflict. Approaching your 62nd birthday you have the Cuban Missile Crisis, a tipping point in the Cold War. Life on our planet, as we know it, could well have ended. Great leaders prevented that from happening.

As you turn seventy-five, the Vietnam War finally ends. Think of everyone on the planet born in 1900. How do you survive all of that? A kid in 1985 did not think their 85-year-old grandparent understood how hard school was. Yet those grandparents (and now great grandparents) survived through everything listed above.

Perspective is an amazing art. Let us try and keep things in perspective. Let us be smart, help each other out, and we will get through all of this. In the history of the world, there has never been a storm that lasted. This too, shall pass.
