


SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM INFORMATION !!!!


In September, we celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. We have been carrying a heavy cross, a weighty burden throughout this year. Jesus carried an even greater burden, the weight all sin for all time. Sacred Scripture says, "For

WHY BUY LIFE INSURANCE WHEN I ALREADY HAVE COVERAGE AT MY WORKPLACE?

When you work for a great employer that values its workers, you often get access to a suite of benefits, including retirement account matching and several types of insurance. Many large employers offer group life insurance, an inexpensive type of life insurance that typically offers high levels of coverage at an extremely low monthly cost.

Employers may offer a range of insurance benefits for employees, including health, dental, vision, disability, life, and accidental death & dismemberment (AD&D). Each insurance has its own place and value for workers. Group life insurance is a type of life insurance where a single policy contract covers all enrolled workers. I would argue that the opposite is true in this instance. If you have a regular job that offers group life insurance, it's probably a good idea to sign up for it in addition to your own life insurance policy.
