A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAPTER PRESIDENT...


Brother Knights of the Pittsburgh Chapter,

If you have a GPS, enter 28 Garfield Street, Natrona PA 15065



From north or south of Pittsburgh via Route 28:

- ♦ Drive on route **PA-28**
- ◆ Take exit 14 toward Tarentum
- Merge onto Bull Creek Rd/ PA-366/Red Belt
- ◆ At top of hill, get into left lane at the stop light
- ◆ Turn left on East 10th Avenue
- You will pass Duster's
 Funeral Home at the first stop light & then Krynicki's
 Funeral Home on your left at the second stop light continue straight
- You will pass through one more stop light. In one block, turn right on Argonne Drive (there will be Highlands Middle School at this turn).
- ◆ Follow this road down the hill into Natrona
- Turn right and cross the tracks and immediately turn right on Blue Ridge Avenue
- ◆ Turn left at Garfield Street

9 MOVIES THAT EVERY CATHOLIC MAN SHOULD WATCH



Our list of recommended movies contains quality films that are perfect to engage men in thoughtful discussion. The list, originally designed for College Knights, will inspire men of any age.

- 1) **A Man for All Seasons** St. Thomas More was awesome, in the truest sense of the word. He held to his faith and conscience and refused to declare Henry VIII as head of the Church of England, even though he knew he would be executed for it.
- 2) **Judgment at Nuremberg** In this fictionalized story, the Best Picture-nominated film centers on a military tribunal and offers a glimpse at what happened to Nazis after the Holocaust.
- 3) **On the Waterfront** This Best-Picture winner tells the story of an uneducated former boxer who stands up against corrupt union bosses who have unmitigated power. Is it anti-Communist? Yes. Does it have pro-Catholic teachings? Yes.
- 4) **Henry V** The movie deals with themes of war and peace, brotherhood and leadership, manipulation and trust. But it's also an underdog story, as the British troops were outnumbered 5 to 1 against the French at the real battle.
- 5) **The Mission** Robert De Niro stars in this movie about a Jesuit missionary evangelizing the native people of 18th-century South America.
- 6) We Were Soldiers Although violent, the battle scenes are accurate portrayals of the events that changed the course of the Vietnam War.
- 7) **Liberating a Continent** St. John Paul II's trip to Poland in 1978 brought hope to a continent split by the Soviet Union's "Iron Curtain." It may not be an action-packed movie, but it's about real people, real lives, real consequences and the real power of prayer.
- 8) **For Greater Glory** In the 1920s, Mexican Catholics were persecuted by their government, fighting for their lives and the right to practice their faith. Many people were martyred during the conflict including six Knights who were later canonized.
- 9) **Shane** Dealing with themes of heroism, redemption and justice, this film centers on a former gunslinger who tries to help a family harassed by a gang. Shane is a classic film, listed number 45 on AFI's 100 Years... 100 Movies list.

A MESSAGE FROM THE STATE SCHOLARSHIP DIRECTOR....

Brother Knights,

August is here already. Summer is almost over. Right now, you and your family are probably getting ready for the start of school, doing back-to-school shopping, making sure your kids have everything they need to return to school.

If your son or daughter is entering their Senior year in High School, college preparation is probably uppermost in their minds. Now is the time to consider applying for a Pennsylvania Knights of Columbus Scholarship. Applications are available on the State Council website. www.pakofc.us/scholarship. [More information is available on page 4 of this newsletter!]

Ten scholarships of \$3000.00, paid in 4 annual installments of \$750.00 each will be awarded across the state. Completed applications must be submitted *no later than* December 31, 2019. I strongly urge applicants not to wait until late December to get the necessary signatures because people may not be available over the Christmas holiday season. Please refer to the flyer for a summary list of conditions that must be met.

Knights of Columbus Pennsylvania State Council Scholarship Program



TEN SCHOLARSHIPS, each totaling \$3,000.00, payable in four installments of \$750.00 per year,

for Knights, sons and daughters of Pennsylvania Knights of Columbus, and Columbian Squires

Each candidate must be at least one of the following:

- A currently paid up member of a Knights of Columbus Council in the jurisdiction of Pennsylvania.
- A child or stepchild of a currently paid up member of a Knights of Columbus Council in Pennsylvania. (NOTE
 Grandchildren are not eligible unless the grandfather is the <u>legal quardian</u> of the applicant.)
- A child or stepchild of a deceased member of the Knights of Columbus in a Pennsylvania council who was not in arrears at the time of his death.
- A qualified Columbian Squire.

Other conditions that must be met:

- The candidate must be a candidate for graduation in a recognized 4-year high school, or its home schooling equivalent, during the term ending June 2020 (or January 2020 for early graduates).
- The candidate must submit a properly completed application form with all the appropriate signatures as required
 on the application to the Scholarship Chairman of the Pennsylvania State Council, Knights of Columbus, no
 later than December 31, 2019.
- The sponsoring council must sell at least 50 "Chance of a Lifetime" (C.O.A.L.) Books (8 tickets per book, total 400 tickets) for the 2019 - 2020 campaign. Books are distributed by the State Council Charities Committee.
- Each candidate must be accepted and enrolled at either a college/university or a School of Nursing connected with a hospital prior to payment of the scholarship. Such college or school may be under Catholic or non-Catholic auspices, subject to approval by the committee.

In order to compete for a Knights of Columbus Pennsylvania State Scholarship you must:

1. Complete the application and mail it no later than December 31, 2019 to:

If you haven't already done so, register and take either the American College Test (ACT) or Scholastic Aptitude
Test (SAT) to be given in Pennsylvania on any of the following dates:

A.C.T. – September 14, October 26, and December 14, 2019 S.A.T. – October 5, November 2, and December 7, 2019

A copy of your test results must be received by December 31, 2019.

There are NO EXCEPTIONS to the above requirements.
