

Thank you to the Natrona Council for hosting the meeting in August. As usual the hot dogs and corn were cooked to perfection!



From Route 28 (north and south):

- Follow PA-28 S to Highland Park Bridge in Sharpsburg. Take exit 6 from PA-28.
- ٠ Continue onto Highland Park Bridge 0.5 mi
- Keep left at the fork, follow signs for PA-8 S/Washington Boulevard and merge onto PA-8 S/Washington Blvd 0.5 mi
- Slight right onto Washington ۲ Blvd 1.9 mi
- Continue onto Fifth Ave 0.4 mi ۲
- ٠ Turn left onto Penn Ave 0.3 mi
- ٠ Turn right onto S Dallas Ave 1.0 mi
- Turn left onto Beechwood Blvd ۲ 1.2 mi
- Turn right to stay on Beechwood ٠ Blvd 495 ft
- Turn left to stay on Beechwood Blvd 1.2 mi
- Sharp left onto Browns Hill Rd ٠ 0.6 mi
- Continue onto Homestead Grays ٠ Bridge 0.6 mi
- Continue onto West St 0.3 mi ٠
- Turn right onto W 13th Ave 0.1 ٠ mi
- Turn right at the 2nd cross street ٠ onto Hays St 476 ft
- Continue onto W 11th Ave
- Destination will be on the right
