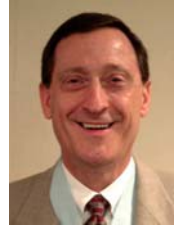

- ◆ Turn LEFT to take ramp onto I-279 S - go 7.0 mi
- ◆ Continue on US-22 W toward AIRPORT/US-30 W - go 4.4 mi
- ◆ Continue on PA-60 N - go 2.0 mi
- ◆ Take exit #3/MOON onto AIRPORT PKY (PA-60-BR) - go 2.5 mi
- ◆ Take ramp toward CORAOPOLIS/SEWICKLEY/THORN RUN ROAD - go 0.1 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on THORN RUN RD - go 0.5 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on BEAVER GRADE RD - go 0.8 mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on PARISH DR - go < 0.1 mi
- ◆ Arrive at 1 PARISH PL, MOON TOWNSHIP, on the LEFT

From the Monroeville area near the Pennsylvania Turnpike Interchange:

- ◆ Take ramp onto I-376 W toward PITTSBURGH/US-22 W - go 14.7 mi
- ◆ Bear LEFT on I-279 S - go 5.6 mi
- ◆ Continue on US-22 W toward AIRPORT/US-30 W - go 4.4 mi
- ◆ Continue on PA-60 N - go 2.0 mi
- ◆ Take exit #3/MOON onto AIRPORT PKY (PA-60-BR) - go 2.5 mi
- ◆ Take ramp toward CORAOPOLIS/SEWICKLEY/THORN RUN ROAD - go 0.1 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on THORN RUN RD - go 0.5 mi
- ◆ Turn LEFT on BEAVER GRADE RD - go 0.8 mi
- ◆ Turn RIGHT on PARISH DR - go < 0.1 mi and arrive at 1 PARISH PL, MOON TOWNSHIP, on LEFT.

Name and Description of Project: “40 Days for Life” – This project is a national one that our council participated in. This project is the participation in activities that support life and try to end abortion. Our council prayed one decade of the Rosary each day, for forty days; prayed the Rosary in front of an abortion mill once a week; and helped at a healing service at Epiphany Catholic Church. Also, each time members prayed in front of the abortion mill, they fasted one meal and donated that money to the poor box at Epiphany. These members then had the opportunity to attend confession. Our council fought to preserve life from conception to natural death.

Cost estimates – Item(s) – Total: No cost was needed except for the individual members’ donations to the poor box.

Materials required: No materials were required. We did hold a couple of signs at the abortion mill. These signs had pro-life statements on them.

Preparations necessary: The only preparations needed for the project was a discussion about what we wanted to do as a council.

Manpower/Hours required: A total of 64 hours were required.

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF A SECOND VICE-PRESIDENT OF THE PITTSBURGH CHAPTER?
