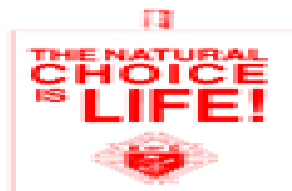

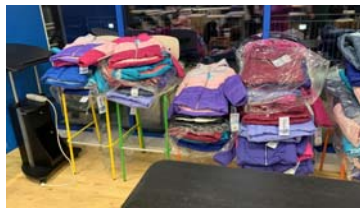

TURKEYS, PIES, AND A WARM WALK TO THE CAR

St. Thomas the Apostle Council and the Pittsburgh Chapter joined the Best of the Batch Foundation to provide Coats for Kids during the Foundation’s Thanksgiving Dinner Distribution event. As part of the State Council’s commitment to distribute 10,000 coats this year, the Pittsburgh Chapter received two cases of coats to distribute to local children. The Chapter joined forces with the Chapter President’s home council, St. Thomas the Apostle Council #2201 to find a location to pass out the coats to families in need. As advised by Council Chaplain Father Dan Sweeney, Chapter President Tim Richards reached out to the local Police Department in Munhall to discuss opportunities to get the coats to kids who needed them. Munhall Police Officer Shannon, who works with the community outreach for the police department, made quick work to connect our Coats for Kids distribution with the Best of the Batch Foundation which is located right next door to the Police Station. The Best of the Batch Foundation is a community-based, non-profit created by Former Pittsburgh Steeler, Homestead PA native, and all-around great guy Charlie Batch and his wife LaTasha. The Foundation gives back to the Homestead and Munhall communities in a variety of ways, including providing year-round educational programming and a safe place for kids to go after school, doctor services, and adopting families to help them get through holidays like Christmas and Thanksgiving.

On Monday, November 21, 2022, the Best of the Batch Foundation was distributing laundry baskets of food to 100 local families in need that included everything they would need to make a special Thanksgiving meal for their families, from sweet potatoes and stuffing mix to a frozen turkey for the main dish, and pumpkin pie for dessert!

Council #2201 and the Pittsburgh Chapter joined in on the giving. Before families made their way through the path of food that was set up for them, they were able to stop in at the dance studio across the hall to have the children try on brand new coats to keep them warm this winter. Over 100 coats were available to select from, and about a dozen Council and Chapter Knights and their wives were on hand to help distribute the coats including Regional Program Director Michael Lynch and his Lovely Lady Anne, Chapter President and State Secretary Tim Richards and Lady Tiffany, and the Grand Knight of Council 2201, Thomas Volk. We hope you enjoy the pictures of the event as much as we enjoyed being a part of the joy of giving this holiday season!
