

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAPLAIN

Brother Knights:

February and March bring us into a time of preparation in the Church's liturgical calendar. On February 2nd we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. This has also in times past been known as Candlemas Mass. This celebration occurs 40 days after Christmas. Traditionally there is a ritual of blessing all the candles that will be used during the liturgies at each parish. Some parishes have continued this tradition throughout the years and others are bringing back this beautiful tradition. This feast is a reminder that Jesus Christ is the Light of the world. We reflect at this Mass on the proclamation of Simeon the prophet, "Lord now you let you servant go in peace... my own eyes have seen the salvation of all the peoples." (Luke 2:29 ff) This feast calls us to prepare our hearts for the Light of the world.



In March we will begin the penitential season of Lent. This is the great season of preparation. We take 40 more days to prepare for Easter season, the greatest season in the Church. Between the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord and Ash Wednesday begin to reflect on what you will make as a sacrifice (fasting) for Lent. But this year attach to it a purpose, that is to say, Lord I will make this fast for... When we add a purpose to our fasting it allows us to step out of our complacency and comfort zones to grow in holiness of the Lord.

May these times of preparation remind us that we are always preparing for that day when we will meet the Lord and give an account of our faithfulness to him. May this feast and season of preparation be a time of renewal and purification for each of you and for the Church.

The Supreme Court is set to rule on whether the city of Boston was right to stop a Christian Flag from flying over City Hall.

For years, the city rotates dozens of flags on a pole outside City Hall, some flags have celebrated Veterans, LGBTQ pride, paramedics and more, to promote diversity.

However in 2017 when an conservative activist Harold Shurtleff applied to hoist a "Christian flag" city officials wouldn't let it fly. City Hall originally stated: "The blue and white flag, with a red Latin cross in one corner, would violate the long-held principle of separation of church and state."

The Supreme Court heard oral arguments on Tuesday in a case that has united unlikely parties, posing the question, "Is it religious discrimination if the city of Boston prevents a man from flying a "Christian" flag on a flagpole outside City Hall where other groups have displayed banners of their own?". by Alex Collett – Premier Christian News

According to 'La Stampa,' Pope Francis went to a newly renovated record shop to bless it.
