



Special Olympics Pennsylvania (SOPA) is a movement that dates back to 1970. It started as a small track and field competition at West Chester University but despite its size and scope, an official Special Olympics program came into being that day thanks to the dedication, determination and vision of event organizers and volunteer directors. Since then, SOPA has grown to serve over 13,000 athletes annually in the start across nine different regions because of our great volunteers. Our region, the Three Rivers Region, serves over 3,000 of those amazing athletes. To be a Special Olympics athlete, you must have an intellectual disability, developmental disability, or cognitive delay. Additionally, SOPA strives to create a unified world by promoting inclusion, uniting communities, and changing attitudes. Through Unified Sports, SOPA brings together individuals with and without intellectual disabilities as equal teammates in training and competition. This growing statewide program builds fully inclusive schools and communities, promotes respect and acceptance, and facilitates meaningful relationships between people of all abilities.

Currently, Special Olympics PA offers over 22 different sports for athletes to participate in during a seasonal approach. These athletes compete as locally as their school and also travel abroad to places like Berlin, Germany, the host of this year's world games. All of those athletes participate FREE of charge because of the support of great people like the Knights of Columbus. One of those athletes is a trained Global Messenger of Special Olympics, Tommy Kreutzer, who is also a seven-year brother Knight with council 13959! He loves being involved with Special Olympics because it brings him confidence and it allows him to be included! His passion for sports and his church aligns beautifully together with the Knights of Columbus.

The Special Olympics experience fills a critical need in the lives of people with intellectual disabilities by providing opportunities for physical activity, social interaction, and the demonstration of competence to themselves, their families, and the community. Athletes learn developmental and life skills as the benefits of participation translate beyond sports, helping them to live more independent and rewarding lives. Special Olympics also provides a positive venue for families, volunteers, and donors to become part of a caring community, and to become involved in the movement.


