
Some of the great joys for me so far in my time as Chief Shepherd of the Church of Pittsburgh have been the opportunities to lead pilgrims from our diocese to encounters like no other with our Holy Father at World Youth Days in 2008 in Sydney, Australia and 2011 in Madrid, Spain. To see the vibrancy of the faith of the young people—who had come from literally every country in the world—was an experience I will never forget. It is my firm belief that there was not a young person who went who did not have their faith strengthened and enlivened through the experience. Besides strengthening the faith of all who attend, World Youth Day has also proven to be an incredible stimulus for young people to consider and answer a call to the priesthood or religious life. A recent survey conducted of the men to be ordained to the priesthood this year found that one out of five of them had attended a World Youth Day prior to entering the seminary.

With all of that in mind, I am writing once again to ask for your help. As the one most responsible for the formation of our seminarians into holy, healthy, on-fire priests, I do not want to pass up the opportunity to take our seminarians to World Youth Day this July in Krakow, Poland. The impact that it made on them the last time, the opportunity they had to connect personally with our Holy Father, the way it strengthened each of their vocations, and the opportunity it gave them to promote vocations makes it a “must do.” I am so grateful to you, my brother Knights, for helping to make the last World Youth Day experience possible for our seminarians, and I am hoping and praying that you can help once again.
